The Blackjack Discount – Rules of Participation

- 1. Preparation of tax returns associated with Chapter 1 and Chapter 2 of Subtitle A of the Internal Revenue Code, including amendments, are **eligible** for the Blackjack Discount, including:
 - a. Form 1040 series
 - b. Form 1041, 1065, or 1120 series
 - c. State equivalents of the above returns
- 2. Services **ineligible** for the Blackjack Discount include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Employment tax or payroll services
 - b. GET or sales tax
 - c. HARPTA or similar
 - d. Preparation of estate tax, gift tax, excise tax, and information returns
 - e. Business formation, business services, and FinCEN reports
 - f. Representation, consultation, planning, or other services
- 3. Participation in the discount is completely voluntary and at the sole discretion of the client. No other discounts will be given in lieu of participation.
- 4. The discount is applied on a per-invoice basis. Gameplay is conducted after the client authorizes filing of their tax return(s) but **prior** to finalization and payment of invoice.
- 5. The standard rules of blackjack shall apply with the following changes:
 - a. To comply with state anti-gambling statutes, no wager is permitted
 - b. The only moves allowed are:
 - i. Hit player draws another card
 - ii. Stand player draws no more card, and dealer completes their hand
 - iii. **Double Down** on any two cards, only one card is permitted to be drawn
 - iv. **Split** on any pairs, creates two hands
 - 1. May re-split all pairs, up to four hands permitted
 - 2. Aces are only allowed one card
 - v. **Surrender** automatic forfeiture of the game
 - c. Dealer must hit soft 17 (H17 rule).
 - d. All cards in shoe are deemed shuffled. Dealer shall shuffle hand-dealt cards.
 - e. Dealer shall burn one card facedown before dealing the first round.
- 6. At the conclusion of every hand, the three possible outcomes are:
 - a. Win player wins a discount equal to the point-value of their hand, not to exceed 21%
 - b. **Push** a new hand shall be played
 - c. Lose player does not receive the discount this time
- 7. For split hands, the discount is the average point-value of winning hands.
 - a. Lost or pushed hands are counted as $\frac{0}{1}$ in the calculation.
 - b. If all hands in the round push, then a new hand shall be played.
 - c. All discounts are rounded to the nearest whole percentage.
- 8. Gameplay may be conducted in person or via FaceTime.
